NEW SECRETARY GIVES ANOTHER ANGLE ON JOBS Would Spread Orders Over State Where Workers Are [By the Associated Press] Harrisburg, April 8—Vocational training and contract "pooling" are rapidly bringing nearer the time when Pennsylvania industry—based on more than a billion dollars worth of defense orders—may expand into sections of the state where there is still "widespread unemployment," the Commerce department reports today.
